## SCHOLARSHIP POLICY STATEMENT

1. At least three members of the Scholarship Committee will work with the High School Scholarship Selection Committee, according to their schedule. Usually, interviews are in April, selections in May, and awards in June.
2. The President of the Women's Club will present awards at the June ceremony or send a representative.
3. The Women's Club will raise money during the year for the grants. The money raised will be placed in a savings account, and a minimum balance of \$200.00 will always be kept in the account.
4. The Selection Committee will decide the amount of the grants and how the money shall be allocated. The amount of the individual grants may vary from year to year.
5. The Women's Club Scholarship money shall be given to high school students, residing in Paramus, who apply through the process, and who are scholastically in the upper half of the graduating class. The selection committee will choose young men and women who show promise, have good records, and are in need of financial help.
6. The grants will go to students who have been accepted at a school of higher learning. This might be a 1 year, 2 year or 4 year school or college.
7. The Women's Club scholarships shall be awarded for the 1<sup>st</sup> year of study only. Checks will be mailed by the club's treasurer, after student sends verification of enrollment, directly to the student. Grants may be used for tuition or books.
8. Awards will be made to deserving applicants, regardless of race, creed, color or country of origin.
